



India's Hidden Gems: Villages That Inspire!

Dharhara— Where Trees Grow With Daughters



This unique tradition began over a decade ago, when villagers started planting at least 10 fruit or neem trees every time a girl was born. The idea was simple yet profound: treat daughters as a blessing, not a burden, and give them — and the Earth — a future worth nurturing. These trees are more than just symbols; they are living savings. As they grow, they offer fruits, shade, and even timber — forming a green inheritance for the girl's education or marriage.

What started as a family practice soon became a community culture. Over 100,000 trees now flourish in Dharhara, turning the village into a lush and thriving example of how age-old values can lead to modern solutions. The initiative also supports biodiversity, improves air quality, and prevents soil erosion — all while making a bold statement for girl child empowerment.

Dharhara reminds us that big changes don't always need big budgets — just big hearts. Through a simple gesture of planting trees, this small village is growing a greener, kinder, and more equal world.

Paella: Spain's Golden Dish of logetherness

When you think of Spanish food, one dish shines as bright as the Mediterranean sun: Paella (pronounced pa-eh-ya). More than just a meal, paella is a symbol of celebration, a story of the countryside, and a gathering of flavors and people.

Paella was born in the fields of Valencia, a region on Spain's eastern coast. Long ago, farm workers would gather around lunchtime and cook rice in wide, shallow pans over an open fire. They added whatever ingredients were on hand—vegetables, snails, beans, or rabbit. This simple dish became the famous Paella Valenciana. The word Paella actually comes from the old Latin word "patella," meaning a flat pan. Over time, the name came to refer not just to the pan, but to the delicious dish itself! What makes paella special is not just its flavor—it's how it brings people together. In Spain, paella is usually made for large gatherings: birthdays, village festivals, or Sunday family lunches. The giant pan is placed at the center, and everyone eats together, laughing and sharing stories.

Cooking paella is a social ritual—with roles passed down through generations. It's not just a dish; it's a celebration of Spanish culture and community

Paella has traveled far beyond Spain. From fancy restaurants in New York to food markets in Delhi, it's loved for its bold flavors and festive feel. Though many versions now exist, the spirit of paella remains the same—sharing, celebration, and togetherness. In Valencia, there's even an annual World Paella Day (September 20), where chefs from around the world come together to cook and compete—with giant paella pans that can feed hundreds!

Act of Kindness

Spreading Kindness at the Cow Shelter - A Heartwarming Experience



- A recent initiative by a Gujarati community aimed to spread love between humans and animals, while teaching children the value of compassion. The focus was to encourage kindness toward voiceless beings—especially among the younger generation.
- A group of 17 of us—including 2 children, teenagers, and volunteers— visited a cow shelter in Munibas, Palghar (West). We brought: 2800 kg of cucumbers and tomatoes,3000 jaggery filled Gujarati chapatis 200 kg of lapsi (sweet dish)
- Children were excited to feed the cows, and we volunteers guided them with care and humility. The atmosphere was full of joy, learning, and love. A sudden downpour added to the fun, making the day even more memorable.
- Personally, it was fulfilling to teach kids the values I learned from my elders. True happiness, I realized, lies not in material things but in giving, sharing, and caring.
